- Arts & Entertainment by the Sea offering opportunity for various artistic & musical expressions.
- Health & Nutrition by the Sea offering a fun, hands-on approach to better understanding food choices, nutritional content, and the impact on how you feel.
- Sports and Fitness by the Sea offering opportunity to interact with local sports celebrities and trainers to learn simple tips for staying active and fit as an important part of daily routine.



From Camden to Philadelphia, more than 100,000 children between the ages of 5 through 17 live in poverty. The Angels on the Atlantic program is tailored to fit the needs of children in various established summer recreation programs as well as area private and parochial schools with summer programs. In addition, the program extends to youth participants of local organizations, including: Big Brothers and Sisters, Caring People Alliance, Philadelphia Cares, Camden County Recreation Centers, and Police Athletic League.
